- Measuring the impact of the Parikrma model on children through their learning achievement, acquired knowledge level and skill sets, health and nutritional status, self-esteem and level of aspiration
- > To gauge the perception of parents about the Parikrma model.



# **BSW Dual Approach**

### **Step 1: Qualitative Model**

 To gauge the perception of different stakeholders about Parikrma model as well as the impact of the program.



### **Step 2: Quantitative Model**

 To measure the impact of the program on academic, career, personality development and extra curricular activities of students.

# High quality and holistic education are seen as mainstays of Parikrma





#### **Students**

- Educational inputs are visible to them – good English, multiple activities
- Well supported by teachers in understanding child's needs and learning styles



 Directly attribute their personality and success to Parikrma – education, activities, confidence, life skills



Parikrma's stress on nutritional fulfillment for its students finds appreciation across. 3 meals a day is considered way more wholesome and generous than the 'stipulated' midday meal

# The focus on health, especially mental health, is a major delight factor and differentiator for Parikrma





#### **Students**

- Confidence encouraged to express opinions, interact with adults one-on-one, compete with other schools



- Healthcare check-ups, guidance and hygiene inputs bring new concepts into the home, impact their lives.
- Special initiatives like uterus check up done to educate the mothers about cancer. This makes the mother feels that they are cared for.



- Feel smarter and more confident than peers because of Parikrma's enabling environment - confidence, teamwork, adaptability, leadership
- Health awareness once inculcated, remains with them



While all schools emphasize societal awareness and engagement, it manifests strongly in Parikrma students because they are given an enabling environment to practice it

 Introduced to new ideas and behaviors beyond the grind of daily life e.g. gender equality, environmental responsibilities



# Spacious, well laid out classrooms and constructive pedagogy makes learning easy and quick to comprehend



#### Infrastructure



The classroom are spacious and well ventilated to accommodate 20-30 kids.

They are equipped with blackboards and smart screens giving the kids an **experience of smart learning.** This process has **improved their understanding of concepts** 



Our teachers show videos on the smart screen while teaching, this helps us understand better. (6<sup>th</sup> std student, Parikrma, Koramangala)





Students can understand the subjects taught to them easily due to the **blended learning** and **detailed explanation** by teachers

Subjects with hands on learning and practical approach are found useful and liked due to higher rate of understanding

Students don't feel the need for additional tuitions (even though parents seek it) because of the quality education at Parikrma

# A simple and continuous orientation towards health care helps students develop their own consciousness around it



## Overall well-being



Constant learning is given about Health Care to which makes them tuned to the health care aspects

During Covid-19, support and arrangement from school were comforting to the students and parents alike

Yearly health check ups are looked forward to and learnings (oral and physical hygiene) are eagerly shared with friends and parents

All Students are sensitized about menstrual health and hygiene → Students across feel this as extremely helpful







Every year we have health check-up, dental check-up, eye, BP, Eye sight, Ear, Height and weight. They tell us what to do and teach us about hygiene. ( $6^{th}$  std students, Parikrma,





During Covid the school arranged for vaccination for us parents. The ensured we were well aware, gave us vaccination. (8<sup>th</sup> std students, Parikrma, Nandini Layout)





# Focus on mental health differentiates Parikrma from other schools and seen as the need of the hour



The idea of being molded to speak out feelings and thoughts distinguishes them from other kids. Positive reinforcement about their thoughts plays a crucial role in building confidence and motivates students to discover self & the underlying interests



The self confidence and self belief stems from the belongingness and association with the teachers and peers at Parikrma.

Being able to talk about feelings and thoughts without the fear is cued as an influence of presence of Quality circle time and life skill classes

Among younger children the toys used in QCR provide a sense of comfort → They lookout for similar toys and hold onto the same during uncomfortable situations

The in-house psychologists, friendship benches/corners enhances the trust in Parikrma and help in getting the attention to trivial matters. The speedy reaction by CDS makes them feel safe and protected.



We share and express our feelings. We do some activities. The object will be moving around us and who ever gets the object they have to talk. I bought a similar teddy bear and sleep along with. (4<sup>th</sup> std student, Parikrma, Sahakarnagar)



# Students find the meals at Parikrma filling, healthy and nutritious



Students feel happy getting wholesome food Parents feel gratification for the well-balanced diet  $\rightarrow$  A huge stress off their mind

Quantity and quality of the food at school is filling. Being loaded with vegetables, pulses and eggs twice a week, the food is seen as nutritious and healthy and well balanced



Parikrma is differentiated from government school because the breakfast and evening snacks which takes care of the overall development of the students

The food served at schools are much valued

As the food quality is considered **higher**, this gives the impression to both students & parents that students are eating healthier food



Students appreciate the food provided by Parikrma as they feel it takes a lot of tension of their parent's head . School seemingly takes care of them like a family







# Parikrma invokes a high degree of social consciousness amongst students, they consider it as life lessons



Activities taken up by Parikrma like environment awareness classes, gardening, animal care, repurposing of waste (making pots from bottles) has a direct influence on making them socially aware

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Students take pride and feel responsible to help **people** in need – Gives them a sense of satisfaction. This feeling is developed in school


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A generous dose of extra curricular activities at Parikrma helps gain confidence to stretch outside their comfort zones and explore and excel in areas of interest

# Students articulate some areas of improvement for a better experience

#### Infrastructure of the school



While the classroom is well ventilated, the visibility of blackboard is obstructed for the front benchers due to the glazing effect caused by the sunlight



Among the younger classes, the students are seated on the floor causing strain in the back → prefer to have back support or desks

#### Education



Frequent changes in the teachers affect the continuity and association with the subject.

Buddy system that helps them in understand the subject from their peers better is missing in class 8 and 11.

#### Extra Curricular



Discontinuity of activities due to the discharge of the teacher is a concerning issue. Continuity in the classes and clubs is desired.

Discontinuity of extra curricular in the higher class **increases pressure** and they feel disconnected with the everyday routine.

Students seek to try all the clubs and select one based on their liking rather than participation because of coercion.





# UNDERSTANDING PARENT'S VIEWPOINT: CLASS 4,6,8,11 AND 12 STUDENTS





Parents opted for Parikrma based on positive feedback on what their child will get - access to quality education, along with free meals and frequent parent teacher connects

### Reason why parents send their child to Parikrma?

Word of mouth and strong recommendations - Parents got to know about Parikrma via their neighbors and coworkers and they recommended strongly

#### **MEAL PROVISION – 3 TIMES**

Less strain on them to prepare wholesome meals for their children. Also saves money and hence seen as a big support

#### **QUALITY EDUCATION- FOR FREE**

Private schools are excessively expensive, and government schools also charge somewhat, whereas Parikrma offers children a quality education free of charge

- After-school classes are available for students who need extra assistance, eliminating the need for tutoring. Lessens the burden on the parents

#### School initiative

- Initiatives taken towards children's well being and safety gives a sense of reassurance in the minds of parents; Hence building trust on Parikrma
- Idea of Parikrma talking about Mental well being highly appreciated → Makes the children expressive and confident which is visible in their children

Improved Family Relationship

- Parikrma offers various programs to promote a healthy and nurturing home environment for children. Family counselling sessions educate parents on social etiquette and behavior around children, fostering a better living and growing space for them.
- Deaddiction camps create a positive atmosphere in the household and gives the father an opportunity to shed bad habits and re connect with their kids

Skill enhancement

 Parikrma supports and motivates women to achieve financial independence by providing them with training in various skills such as tailoring, beauty services, cooking, and more → Women pick up the training easily and hence get practical benefit out of it → Hence most sough after sessions amongst them

Adaptation of a healthier lifestyle

- Parikrma 's health camps provide education on maintaining a healthy lifestyle, while the school offers free vaccinations and health checkups, ensuring that necessary healthcare services are accessible without any financial burden

- Among early jobbers and experienced professionals, a feeling emerging that career counseling should be prioritized to help them make informed decisions. The current counselling is limited to mainstream professions like Science, Commerce and Arts. So, counsellors should be more willing to look beyond regular career streams
- Extracurricular activities and clubs are to be student driven rather than teacher driven. A succession process with the club would improve the involvement of students and alumni in the school activities








# Some of the action points Parikrma can implement to create better impact amongst the stake holders


# Meal program in school/ college


